**ITEM #1-APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE JUNE 10, 2003  
MEETING/REVIEW OF MEETING NOTES FROM THE UN-OFFICIAL MEETING  
ON JULY 22, 2004**

The Minutes of the aforementioned meeting were distributed for approval. One correction was made. An Un-Official meeting was conducted on July 22, 2004 since there was no quorum. Those notes were reviewed by the Board. No action was taken.

**ACTION-** A Motion to approve the Minutes of the June 10, 2003 meeting was made by T. Lytle, seconded by C. Nigida and approved by the Board.

**ITEM #2.0-DISCUSSION OF HEALTH CONCERNS**

D. Corbin brought up Lyme Disease and said that she recently discovered that this disease is not only carried by deer ticks but also centipedes. West Nile Virus was also discussed and D. Hazlett said that the Conservation District will test and treat properties; even private property if permission is given. D. Hazlett suggested putting an article the Borough website about Lyme Disease and West Nile Virus displaying statistics in Adams County and suggestions as to how to prevent the diseases and symptoms to look for.

Dr. Hammett asked about restaurant health inspections and he was advised that in 2004 the State Health Dept. began conducting those inspections for Carroll Valley Borough, and that the Borough does not have a health inspector. It was suggested that the Borough Manager contact the State to ask them to compare their inspections requirements with the Borough's Health Ordinance and ask them to inspect under our requirements as well, and send us a report every year of their findings.

D. Corbin asked about the Frontier Bar-B-Q at the corner of SR16 and SR116. She wanted to know if they provide hand washing facilities for customers and if they have their license displayed. No one knew for sure and she said she would visit the establishment and report her findings.

D. Corbin asked about immunizations for Borough employees and D. Hazlett reported that Municipal Services and Sewer Treatment Plan employees get immunized for Hepatitis and Tetanus. Dr. Hammett, D. Corbin, and C. Nigida said they believed all employees should be immunized against these two diseases as well as given a yearly flu shot.

**ITEM #3.0-REPORT ON HEALTH AND SAFETY FAIR**

T. Lytle and C. Nigida reported that this event has not been scheduled for various reasons. C. Nigida said she would like to see a program at the Borough where the local or State Police would be on the parking lot one day before school begins so that residents can stop by and have their children's safety seats checked. She said many parents do not have their car seats and booster seats installed properly.

The high number of teenage fatalities resulting from traffic accidents. was discussed.

There being no further business a Motion to adjourn was made at 9:40 AM by D. Corbin, seconded by C. Nigida. The Motion carried.
