Dear Mayor Harris:

This letter comes as a response to your request that I follow up with you concerning Carroll Valley Ordinance No. 6-2008 and its relationship to the issues present in our neighborhood regarding toxic burning.

First, let me thank you for the time you spent listening to my concerns when I last visited the Carroll Valley Library at the Carroll Valley Borough Office. I appreciate your attention, your consideration of my questions and complaints, and your kindness shown to me at what was an unscheduled meeting.

Regarding the 19-102 policy which states the following:

"Whereas the Council of the Borough of Carroll Valley has determined that air pollution from open burning may be detrimental to the health, comfort, living conditions, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Borough of Carroll Valley, it is hereby declared to be the policy of the Borough of Carroll Valley to safeguard the citizens of the Borough of Carroll Valley from such air pollution. The open outdoor burning of leaves, grass, and wood creates hazardous byproducts that can irritate eyes and lungs, obscure visibility, soil nearby surfaces, create odors, increase fire hazards and risks, and pose other threats. Open burning can also substantially increase the discomfort of people who suffer from asthma, chronic bronchitis, and other respiratory ailments. The purpose of this ordinance is to reduce the negative impacts of open burning of leaves, yard clippings, and other landscape debris throughout the borough and to promote public health, safety, and welfare and prevent property damage within the Borough of Carroll Valley."

I see no evidence of this policy in our Carroll Valley neighborhood. I see no evidence of any kind of consideration for the "health, comfort, living conditions, welfare, and safety" of the citizens of my neighborhood in Carroll Valley. As I told you when we spoke, I have brought basic concerns of "health, comfort, living conditions, welfare, and safety" (quality of life issues)

to your chief of police and borough manager, and neither of them did anything to help me, even though I referred them to the proper ordinances that they were not enforcing. These were various issues concerning insufficient removal of debris/fallen trees, oversized/industrial (and junky) motor vehicles in residential areas, smoky industrial kitchens for businesses in residential areas, constant traffic day and night in and out of a narrow cul-de-sac, speeding and motor noise at all times day and night in residential areas, trash containers left out on the street weeks at a time, etc., etc., etc. Instead of doing what they could to help me, both the police chief and borough manager told me that enforcement of the related ordinances would "bother" or "make angry" other residents. So, in other words, their doing nothing to resolve the problems makes their own lives easier, and supports the famous saying that states "some people are just more equal than others." Thus, law-abiding, tax-paying residents of Carroll Valley like us must accommodate the freedoms and faults of law-breaking residents of Carroll Valley and just put up with anything that these folks want to do.

Regarding the 19-104 regulations which state the following:

"Open burning of yard clippings, leaves, shrubbery, brush, tree branches, and tree trimmings may occur within Carroll Valley Borough subject to the following:

- The open burning event takes place from DAWN TO DUSK.
- The property owner assures Carroll Valley Borough that the proposed fire is on their residential property and WILL REMAIN ON THEIR PREMISES, WITH CONSTANT SUPERVISION AND CONTROL, FOR THE DURATION OF THE OPEN BURNING EVENT.
- No open burning event shall occur WITHIN 50 FEET OF AN EXISTING BUILDING OR ANY PAVED PORTION OF A PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY.
- The property owner MUST PERSONALLY SUPERVISE ANY AND ALL FIRES, which occur on the property owner's land.
- The property owner MUST BE PRESENT OUTDOORS ON THE PROPERTY AT THE FIRE AT ALL TIMES WHEN SMOKE OR FLAMES ARE PRESENT.
- NO SMOKE IS ALLOWED TO OCCUR AFTER DUSK."

The residents of 8 Woodland Trail (next to us) burn various yard debris several times a week, all throughout the day and into the night. The fire is in their backyard too close to the street and to our trees, our yard, and our deck, so their toxic smoke blows directly toward our home every time. As I told you, I have asthma, so while they are burning their debris, I cannot comfortably or safely go outside, walk our dog, or sit on our deck while they continue to burn their debris all day long until it goes out by itself. The fire still smokes and smolders into the late evening (past 8:30 p.m.) when it is no longer "dusk."

As far as SUPERVISION goes, other than for a limited time when the female resident seems to dance around her flames, there is nobody to be seen outside despite the continuing smoke and flames. I suppose these residents will say that they are "observing" their fire and smoke by looking out their window in the "comfort" of their home. They do not wish to BE PRESENT OUTDOORS ON THEIR PROPERTY AT THE FIRE AT ALL TIMES WHEN SMOKE OR

FLAMES ARE PRESENT for the lengthy duration of their open burning. Again, WE are obligated to watch all their smoke and flames from the "prison" of our home.

Inconsiderate and irresponsible folks like these are destroying our neighborhood, and all of you there at the borough office, with our hard-earned tax-payer dollars, have allowed them to do just that. We have to look at and live with their messes every single day. Although the stated policies and ordinances of the Carroll Valley Borough are respectful and protective of all residents, the ENFORCEMENT of these policies and ordinances do not respect or protect ALL RESIDENTS of the Borough.

Unfortunately, I do not expect much to change here in the Borough of Carroll Valley due to the track record of your officials. This is why we are doing what we can to be able to afford to move out of this borough. It is much too easy for your police chief and borough manager to just do nothing to earn their salaries. However, for the sake of health, welfare, justice, and quality of life, we must again reiterate our concerns as law-abiding, tax-paying residents of Carroll Valley whose concerns are important and just as important as those of any other residents. It is wrong for neighbors (that we are stuck with) to choose to do whatever they want to do and to make our neighborhood a hell-hole, a junkyard trail. All residents of Carroll Valley Borough should be held accountable to the law or bear the appropriate consequences of breaking the law. Backyard burning (especially in rural areas like ours) should be limited to no more than once a month (better yet, once a quarter), rather than any and as many times anyone wishes, and certainly not multiple times a week. Backyard burning multiple times a week is a health and safety hazard (and a disgusting habit), especially for people like us with chronic respiratory ailments. Backyard burning multiple times a week does not enhance the quality of life and is definitely "detrimental to the health, comfort, living conditions, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Borough of Carroll Valley."

A basic and reasonable suggestion to improve the quality of life in the Borough of Carroll Valley, and to ensure the fulfillment of the responsibilities of all of its residents, is to supply every year to every resident (especially any new residents) a reminder pamphlet summarizing public health and safety ordinances that must be followed and that will be enforced FOR ALL RESIDENTS, and specifying the criminal and civil penalties that will be imposed if these ordinances are not followed. This action will ensure that the excuse of "we did not know about the ordinances" cannot be used.

Then, after ONE warning, these strict fines and penalties should immediately ensue EACH DAY or EACH EVENT an ordinance is not followed. No good outcomes or changes will occur if officials do not do their jobs and/or if appropriate strict enforcement and immediate collection of criminal and civil penalties are not attached to offenses that are "detrimental to the health, comfort, living conditions, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Borough of Carroll Valley."

This is the response that I can relate to you, and I look forward to any assistance you can give in this important matter. Thank you for listening.

Attached please find another revision to the proposed Chapter 27, specifically regarding accessory buildings and reverse frontage lots.

These errors were noticed by staff while utilizing the pending ordinance doctrine to review new submittals.

ARTICLE XIV GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 1400: Principal Use

Unless specifically provided to the contrary by this Ordinance, the provisions of this Ordinance shall be interpreted to allow only one (1) principal use on a lot.

Section 1401: Statement of Legislative Intent

The following standards shall be applied to all properties within Carroll Valley Borough. These requirements shall supplement requirements that may be found in the zoning district applicable to a specific property, as well as generally applicable standards including, but not necessarily limited to, parking, loading, and signs standards.

Section 1402: Corner Lots

For all corner lots, the front yard setback or build-to line standard, as may be appropriate and as defined in the underlying zoning district, shall be applied along each adjoining street. The rear setback standard shall be applied to the property line opposite the street to which the property is addressed. The side setback standard shall be applied to all other property lines.

Section 1403: Double Frontage Lots

For all double frontage lots, the front yard setback or build-to line standard, as may be appropriate and as defined in the underlying zoning district, shall be applied along the each adjoining street to which the property is addressed. The rear setback standard shall be applied along the street opposite the street to which the property is addressed. The side setback standard shall be applied to all other property lines.

Section 1404: Clear Sight Triangle

No building, structure, sign, fence, landscape planting, or other property improvement regulated by this ordinance may be located within the required clear sight triangle at any street intersection.

Section 1405: Accessory Buildings

Accessory buildings shall be permitted in accordance with the following requirements.

- A. Accessory buildings may only be authorized in the following circumstances.
- 1. asAs accessory to a principal building or use on an existing property.
- 2. As accessory to a principal building or use on an adjoining lot and where both lots are owned by a common owner.

- 3. A building commonly viewed as an accessory building may be placed on a vacant property where said vacant property has limitations, including but not limited to on-lot septic or topographic limitations, that preclude the development of a principal building or use on the property.
- B. Accessory buildings placed on a property with an established principal building shall be located <u>only</u> in the side or rear yard. Accessory building shall not be authorized to be located in the front yard on a property with an established principal building.
- C. Accessory buildings less than or equal to six hundred (600) square feet in size shall be <u>located no closer</u> than ten (10) feet to any side or rear property line. subject to the following setback requirements.
- 1. Accessory buildings authorized by Sections 1405.A.1 and 1405.A.2 above may be located within ten (10) feet of any side or rear property line.
- 2. Accessory buildings authorized by Section 1405. A.3 above shall be subject to the applicable setback requirements of the underlying zoning district.
- D. Accessory buildings greater than six hundred (600) square feet in size shall be subject to the applicable setback requirements of the underlying zoning district.
- E. All accessory buildings shall be subject to the building height standard of the underlying zoning district.

Section 1406: Fences

Fences shall be permitted as an accessory structure in accordance with the following requirements.

- A. Maximum Height Front Yards: The maximum fence height in the R1, R2, and R3 Districts shall be four (4) feet. The maximum fence height in the A, C, and CC Districts shall be six (6) feet.
- B. <u>Maximum Height Side and Rear Yards</u>: The maximum fence height in the R1, R2 and R3 Districts shall be six (6) feet. The maximum fence height in the A, C, and CC Districts shall be eight (8) feet.
- C. <u>Nonconforming Uses</u>: For nonconforming uses, the maximum fence height shall be the maximum fence height authorized within the zoning district where the nonconforming use would be a permitted use.
- D. <u>Hazardous Attachments</u>: No fence in the R1, R2, and R3 Districts or on residential properties in the A, C, and CC Districts shall include barbed wire or similar hazardous attachments. Nonresidential properties in the A, C, and CC Districts may include no more than three (3) strands of barbed wire or may include wrought iron spikes.
- E. <u>Electrification</u>: No fence in any zoning district may be electrified. The following types of fences are exempted from this standard:

LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE OF INTENTION OF THE BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY, COUNTY OF ADAMS, PENNSYLVANIA, BY THE CARROLL VALLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL, TO REPEAL THE CARROLL VALLEY BOROUGH ZONING ORDINANCE OF 1976, AS AMENDED, AND ENACT A NEW CARROLL VALLEY BOROUGH ZONING ORDINANCE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Borough of Carroll Valley, County of Adams, Pennsylvania, by the Carroll Valley Borough Council, intends to repeal the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1976, as amended, and enact a new Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance. The Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance under consideration for enactment is summarized as follows:

Article I: Establishes the short title of the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance, identifies the statutory authority for said Ordinance, and establishes the purposes of said Ordinance.

Article II: Establishes guidelines for interpretation and definitions of specific terms used in the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance.

Article III: Establishes the zoning districts used in the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance, the Zoning Map of said Ordinance, guidelines for interpretation of zoning district boundaries, and a table summarizing the permitted uses of each zoning district.

Article IV: Establishes the Agricultural (A) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article V: Establishes the Residential Conservation (R1) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article VI: Establishes the Residential Low Density (R2) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article VII: Establishes the Residential Medium Density (R3) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article VIII: Establishes the Community Core (CC) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article IX: Establishes the Commercial (C) District, and the permitted uses and site development standards associated with said District.

Article X: Establishes the Floodplain Overlay (FO) District, and the additional site development standards associated with properties located in said Overlay District.

Article XI: Establishes the Riparian Buffer Overlay (RBO) District, and the additional site development standards associated with properties located in said District.

Article XII: Establishes the Forested Lands Overlay (FLO) District, and the additional site development standards associated with properties located in said District.

Article XIII: Establishes the Airport Overlay (AO) District, and the additional site development standards associated with properties located in said District.

Article XIV: Establishes general requirements that are applied either to specific types of development or to properties in specific locations.

Article XV: Establishes performance standards to be applied to specific uses of property.

Article XVI: Establishes standards establishing the number of off-street parking spaces required for specific uses and the design of parking lots. Establishes off-street loading and unloading standards.

Article XVII: Establishes standards to regulate the use, number, type, size, and location of signs.

Article XVIII: Establishes standards governing the continuation and expansion of nonconforming uses and structures.

Article XIX: Establishes standards governing the administration of the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance. Establishes the position of Zoning Officer and establishes the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Hearing Board.

Article XX: Establishes guidelines regarding how to interpret the standards of the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance in the context of other Federal, State, County, or local requirements.

Article XXI: Provides the date of adoption and the signatures of the Carroll Valley Borough Council President, the Mayor, and the Carroll Valley Borough Assistant Manager / Secretary.

Appendix A: Provides the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Map.

Appendix B: Provides the Carroll Valley Borough Table of Uses.

Appendix C: Provides the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Map – Riparian Buffer Overlay.

Appendix D. Provides the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Map – Forested Lands Overlay.

Appendix E: Provides the Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Map – Airport Overlay.

Appendix F: Includes the document "DCNR Invasive Plan List" for reference purposes.

The new Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance will be considered for adoption on Tuesday, June 14, 2022, at the Carroll Valley Borough Council's regular public meeting, commencing at 7:00 PM, prevailing time, at the Carroll Valley Borough Municipal Building, 5685 Fairfield Road, Carroll Valley, Pennsylvania, 17320. If approved by the Carroll Valley Borough Council, and enacted pursuant to Act 247 of 1968, as amended, the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, the effective date of the new Carroll Valley Borough Zoning Ordinance will be July 1, 2022.

Attached please find **Resolution #4-2022**; the resolution providing for the supplemental appropriations for the 2022 Budget. Action Requested: I ask that you Adopt Resolution #4-2022 and Authorize Borough Staff to execute all documents necessary for the proper compliance of the Final Rule for the expenditure of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA RESOLUTION #4-2022

A RESOLUTION OF BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY, ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 2022 BUDGET

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021 the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 became law, providing to The Borough of Carroll Valley (hereinafter, the "Borough") a direct, non-competitive federal formula grant from the U.S. Treasury Department (the "Treasury") totaling Four Hundred Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Six Dollars and Four Cents (\$412,606.04) identified as Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CSLFRF); and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2021 the Treasury published an Interim Final Rule for the use of the CSLFRF; and

WHEREAS, on December 14, 2021, Borough Council adopted a budget for the calendar year 2022; and

WHEREAS, January 27, 2022, Treasury issued a Final Rule, which modified the regulations contained in the Interim Final Rule; and

WHEREAS, the Final Rule offers a standard allowance for revenue loss of up to \$10 million, allowing recipients to elect a standard amount of revenue loss or complete a full revenue loss calculation; and

WHEREAS, recipients of CSLFRF that select the standard allowance may use that amount — in many cases their full award — for government services, with streamlined reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Code, Section 1312, authorizes Borough Council, in its reasonable discretion, to make supplementary appropriations and transfers from one appropriation to another during the fiscal year, if it is within the current year's revenues, 8 Pa.C.S.A §1312; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council of The Borough of Carroll Valley wishes to provide for supplemental appropriations of the CSLFRF from the 2022 Borough Budget in accordance with the Final Rule as published by Treasury.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by Borough Council of The Borough of Carroll Valley as follows:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. Borough Council hereby elects the revenue replacement standard allowance in accordance with the Final Rule, which equals the Borough's full award amount of \$412,606.04.




Special News / Achievements:

• As a reminder, the Carroll Valley Borough Police Department has partnered with the Rite Aid Foundation and KidCents Safe Medication Disposal Program to offer a medication disposal unit at the police station. Items accepted include prescription medications and over-the-counter medications. This collection will not accept illegal drugs or paraphernalia, lotions or liquids, inhalers, aerosol cans, needles, thermometers and hydrogen peroxide. Drop off can be made anytime the office is open. The department does not collect any information from the individual dropping off the medications.

Crime Data:

Key to reading the following page:

- 1. At the top left, you see overall statistics for the month. Total offenses and clearance rate refer to Group "A" offenses. Arrests refer to Group "A" and Group "B". This data is only for Carroll Valley Borough.
- 2. It also includes crime rates and arrest rates, however this calculation is not yet functioning on the PA State Police system, so they display as -0-. When working correctly, they will report in the national standard of per 100,000 population. As such, when it does calculate, it shows the rate as if the Carroll Valley population was 100,000. By doing this, it makes the rate comparable regardless of the size of the jurisdiction.
- 3. The column below on the left shows all Group "A" offenses. Offenses can be generally cleared by:
 - a. Arrest (by charging someone with the crime).
 - b. Victim Refused Prosecution = Prosecution limited by victim, or;
 - c. Exceptional Clearance = Charges could be filed but for cause are not.
- 4. In the center, NIBRS adds additional categories, and you can see how they compare year over year for the month reported.
- 5. On the right column, you first see a list of arrests for Group "A" offenses, divided into adults and juveniles.
- 6. At the bottom of the right column, Group "B" arrests are listed. As a major change in NIBRS reporting, Group "B" offenses are only listed when an arrest occurs. Unsolved Group "B" offenses are no longer reported.
- 7. Each NIBRS offense belongs to one of three categories: Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, and Crimes Against Society. Crimes Against Persons, e.g., murder, rape, and assault, are those whose victims are always individuals. The object of Crimes Against Property, e.g., robbery, bribery, and burglary, is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit. Crimes Against Society, e.g., gambling, prostitution, and drug violations, represent society's prohibition against engaging in certain types of activity; they are typically victimless crimes in which property is not the object.

PA SMALL WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrades Project

Awarded \$425,000

GMS has submitted the second reimbursement request (\$189,805). This request will maximize the \$425,000 grant award. However, invoices and proofs of payment must be submitted through the completion of the project. The grant is set to expire on June 30, 2022, and it is anticipated the Project will be done before that timeframe. However, GMS has submitted an extension request on behalf of the Authority to account for any unforeseen delays that may occur and delay the project.

Next Steps: The Authority should provide additional Applications for Payment and cancelled checks when available.

ADAMS COUNTY PARKS, RECREATION, AND GREEN SPACE GRANT PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Path System - Phase I

Awarded \$25,000

The revised drawing and scope, along with an extension request, has been submitted to the County for review and consideration.

Next Steps: If the County approves the re-scope request, and once work commences, the Borough should forward project invoices and cancelled check payments to GMS for reimbursement submissions.

H2O PA – WATER SUPPLY, SANITARY SEWER, AND STORM WATER PROJECTS (H2O)

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Awarded: \$700,000

The H2O grant expires on June 30, 2023. Once the Project has been bid, GMS will need copies of the public advertisement, bid responses, and bid tabulation. GMS is working on the reimbursement request and providing the Solicitor and Borough with a cooperation agreement that outlines the relationship between the Borough and the Authority so both entities can submit reimbursements for costs. Once the cooperation agreement is signed, DCED will process the reimbursement request.

Next Steps: The Borough should have its Solicitor review the cooperation agreement, and, if all parties are in agreement, execute the cooperation agreement. Additionally, the Borough should continue to forward all engineering invoices and evidence of payments to GMS. Once the Project is bid, the Authority should move forward with project construction.

Due to the increase in costs for the Wastewater Treatment Plant project, GMS is looking into additional funding sources that may be a fit for this Project.

COVID-19 ARPA STATE AND LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (SLFRF)

Request: \$206,303.02 (first tranche); \$206,303.02 (second tranche)

In January 2022, the US Department of Treasury published the final rule. The most significant differences between the interim rule and the final rule are the provisions regarding revenue replacement. Under the final rule, municipalities can either calculate their revenue loss OR presume up to \$10 Million in revenue loss. For the Borough, this would mean that all of the ARPA funds received can be allocated to revenue loss and the broad scope of expenditures allowed under this category. The Borough received notice that the first Project and Expenditure Report (Report) is now due April 30, 2022. GMS will assist the Borough with completing and filing the Report(s). GMS provided the Solicitor and the Borough with a draft resolution for review that outlines where the Borough wishes to allocate its APRA funds.

Next steps: Once reviewed by the Solicitor and Borough, the Borough should act on the Resolution. The Borough was set up in the US Treasury portal for reporting. GMS will coordinate with the Borough to compile and submit the necessary Report(s), which is due April 30, 2022. The report became available on the Treasury portal on 4/1/2022.

BROADBAND INITIATIVE

Estimated project cost: \$171,503

Next Steps: GMS continues to review potential funding sources that may cover this initiative.

FEDERAL INFRASTRUCTURE BILL

GMS will continue to research and review the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) bill for additional funding that may be available to support the remaining phase of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades project. In addition, if there are other infrastructure initiatives that the Borough has on its "wish list," these details should be forwarded to GMS. GMS has received the updated cost estimate for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades project and is creating an updated executive summary to be used in vetting additional funding sources, including scheduling meetings with PENNVEST. It has been highly recommended that applicants begin coordination with PENNVEST on any potential project, as a significant portion of the IIJA funds will be routed through this agency. Dates and times for an initial meeting with PENNVEST have been provided to the Borough.

Next Steps: The Borough should provide a cost estimate for any other infrastructure projects that the Borough may have on its capital improvements plan. The Borough should review the dates/times provided for the PENNVEST meeting and respond with possible availability so GMS can finalize the meeting date.


