Special News / Achievements:



• The Carroll Valley Police Department is so pleased to welcome back Patrol Officer Courtney Herring. Herring received her initial field training in Carroll Valley in 2018 before leaving us for other opportunities. Now she is back, and we can take advantage of her knowledge of our community and our residents. She is a valuable addition to the Department. If you see her around, welcome her back!

Special Events:



• Carroll Valley Police has joined the Pennsylvania State Police and over 300 municipal agencies to conduct a targeted aggressive-driving enforcement wave from July 5 through August 21, 2022. We had questions regarding speed enforcement so we thought we would share some additional information. In the PA Vehicle Code, using the authorized speed timing devices, municipal police officers cannot stop a vehicle for speeding unless the speed is 10 or more MPH above the limit, when the limit is less than 55 MPH. However, once stopped, an officer may issue a citation for less than the actual

speed recorded. For instance, a driver might be stopped for driving 35 MPH in a posted 25 MPH (10 over the limit). The officer might choose to issue a citation for 30 MPH in the 25 MPH, giving the

driver a break on the full citation. Where the speed limit is 55 MPH, municipal officers may stop a vehicle for driving just 6 MPH over the posted limit. Hence, no one is being stopped for driving 5 MPH over the speed limit.



- We thought it might also be good explain the "Steer Clear" law in the Commonwealth. When approaching or passing an emergency response area, a person, unless otherwise directed by an emergency service responder, shall:
 - (1) pass in a lane not adjacent to that of the emergency response area, if possible; or
 - (2) if passing in a nonadjacent lane is impossible, illegal, or unsafe, pass the emergency response area at a speed of no more than 20 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit and reasonable for safely passing the emergency response area.

This means when passing an ambulance, police officer on a traffic stop, a disabled vehicle or even utility providers after a disaster, you must move to the next lane if safe or if not SLOW DOWN to 20 MPH less than the speed limit. For instance, in a 45 MPH area, you must slow down to at least 25 MPH before passing. Failure to follow the law can result in a fine of up to \$500 and subsequent offenses carry much larger fines and license suspensions.

Crime Data:

Key to reading the following page:

- 1. At the top left, you see overall statistics for the month. Total offenses and clearance rate refer to Group "A" offenses. Arrests refer to Group "A" and Group "B". This data is only for Carroll Valley Borough.
- 2. It also includes crime rates and arrest rates, however this calculation is not yet functioning on the PA State Police system, so they display as -0-. When working correctly, they will report in the national standard of per 100,000 population. As such, when it does calculate, it shows the rate as if the Carroll Valley population was 100,000. By doing this, it makes the rate comparable regardless of the size of the jurisdiction.
- 3. The column below on the left shows all Group "A" offenses. Offenses can be generally cleared by:
 - a. Arrest (by charging someone with the crime).
 - b. Victim Refused Prosecution = Prosecution limited by victim, or;
 - c. Exceptional Clearance = Charges could be filed but for cause are not.
- 4. In the center, NIBRS adds additional categories, and you can see how they compare year over year for the month reported.
- 5. On the right column, you first see a list of arrests for Group "A" offenses, divided into adults and juveniles.
- 6. At the bottom of the right column, Group "B" arrests are listed. As a major change in NIBRS reporting, Group "B" offenses are only listed when an arrest occurs. Unsolved Group "B" offenses are no longer reported.
- 7. Each NIBRS offense belongs to one of three categories: Crimes Against Persons, Crimes Against Property, and Crimes Against Society. Crimes Against Persons, e.g., murder, rape, and assault, are those whose victims are always individuals. The object of Crimes Against Property, e.g., robbery, bribery, and burglary, is to obtain money, property, or some other benefit. Crimes Against Society, e.g., gambling, prostitution, and drug violations, represent society's prohibition against engaging in certain types of activity; they are typically victimless crimes in which property is not the object.

We have received the final award notification from the Federal Small, Rural, Tribal Body Worn Camera grant. It will provide us \$10,000 over 3 years for the upgrade and expansion of our body cam program. We are providing a \$10,000 in-kind contribution through the Police Department operating the program.

The service vendor, Digital Ally, supplies our current in-car video systems as well as the 2 existing body cameras, so these new cameras will integrate into the existing system. The hardware is provided as a subscription service and includes the equipment as well as the online storage of the data as five-year program. The program includes 5 cameras, so each officer is issued one. If we continue the program after the 3 years of grant funding, the additional 2 year will cost us \$5,100 total.

RECOMMENDED ALTERNATIVE:

Although both alternatives are similar and will provide a great improvement over the current product used by the Borough, I recommend Option #1 as the most appropriate to fill our needs. Time will be saved by learning one- (1) interface and any issues within the modules will be handled more efficiently by dealing with one company versus three- (3). Also, Edmunds' proposal offers additional features not found in Option 2, including Self-Service web-based park rentals and permits. Edmunds Corporation also offers unlimited users and the customer support promise will offer added convenience and peace of mind as we move forward.

HOW TO PAY FOR IT:

It is recommended that the initial cost of \$92,890 be paid for using ARPA funds, minus the \$13,125 already set aside for this purchase in the Capital Reserve Fund. (Borough received \$422,434 in ARPA Funding.)

\$79,765 (ARPA Funds) \$13,125 (Capital Reserve Fund) \$92,890 (Total)

As for the Annual Maintenance Cost of \$47,390, it is proposed that it be paid annually from the Capital Reserve Fund, as it has in recent years. The Capital Reserve Fund will see a significant reduction in planned expenditures as a result of satisfying the New Municipal Building Loan (\$103,634 annually). Funding the annual updates to this software, coupled with paying off the building loan nets the Capital Fund a savings of \$56,244 annually.

\$153,634 (Municipal Building Payment) \$-50,000 (General Fund Transfer to Capital) \$-47,390 (New Annual Cost for Software) \$ 56,244(Available Capital Funds Remaining)

While the proposed annual cost of \$47,390 represents a yearly increase of \$32,015, it also represents significantly expanded service levels. The proposed software modules will expand customer service by providing online 24/7 service to the borough's client base (employees, property owners, contractors, and inspectors). Online service will allow the borough's client base to conduct their business when convenient to them and from the location of their choosing. This is expected to significantly reduce the need for the borough's client base to visit the borough office to conduct their business. The various modules will also fully integrate with the Financial Accounting Module thereby reducing staff data input. The administrative efficiencies provided by the new software modules should increase staff productivity and free up time for additional projects.

The Municipal Services Department would like the Borough to consider purchasing a Utility Task Vehicle and three- (3) attachments to be used in the parks for various purposes. Some of these tasks are currently completed manually or with heavier equipment (dump trucks, skid steer), which proves neither cost-effective nor efficient.

The proposed purchase would be used to maintain our walking paths using the proposed box grader attachment, thereby keeping our walking areas free from trip hazards by maintaining a level walking surface. With the proposed snowplow attachment, the sidewalks and small parking areas can be cleared more efficiently. Utilizing the proposed offset mower attachment, we can more safely and efficiently mow the steep bank areas along the lake banks. It would be used daily for the collection of trash from the 9 trash cans within Carrol Commons and to haul mulch to the various planting and play areas.

Attached are quotes to improve the safety and efficiency of the maintenance of our grounds, and I recommend the following purchases:



The Sewer Department would like the Borough to consider purchasing a sewer line camera and jetter to save on long-term expenses associated with these functions, and to increase our level of service provided to users of the system.

The Carroll Valley Sewer System maintains approximately 45,000 feet of collection lines. Industry standards recommend camera inspections and jetting once every 5-7 years, which equals 6,430 feet per year.

For the last 6 years, the Sewer Department has contracted private companies to inspect and jet an average of 2,504 feet of Borough sewer line (39% of what is needed to meet industry standards). The average cost we paid for this work was \$4,408 annually. For us to complete 100% of the <u>needed</u> cleaning and visual inspections (at the rate we paid in 2022) it would cost the Borough \$14,467.50 annually.

Attached are quotes to purchase the necessary equipment to perform these tasks in-house. I recommend the following purchases:

Ratech Mini Crawler Camera -	\$41,000
General Typhoon Jetter -	\$26,000
Total -	\$67,000

The equipment would also be available to the Municipal Services department to inspect and clear stormwater drainage pipes and we could consider offering camera and jetting services to other municipal entities for a fee.

By investing \$67,000 in this equipment in 2022, the Borough Council would be saving \$295,000 over the 25-year expected life of the equipment, and that's without factoring in inflation.

This letter is being sent to you on behalf of the Fairfield Community Fire Company. The Fairfield Historical Society has agreed to assist us in preserving our historical artifacts. We are planning to renovate the original Fairfield AMVETS Community Ambulance Service building into a museum to house fire company artifacts and memorabilia, as well as make space for artifacts and items collected by the Fairfield Area Historical Society.

This past year the Fairfield Community Fire Company celebrated its 100th year of service. During this time, we have experienced many changes in our Fire Company and the Community. We do not want to lose this history to future generations.

Dear Elected Municipal Officials,

May 11, 2022

It has been a few months since we sent you our last letter, updating you on our county wide high speed fiber broadband project, which included three studies, and a middle mile deployment plan, reaching all of our county anchor institutions. This approach allows us to reach all corners of the county and grow from there. We laid out our next step which is to complete a detailed, engineer based business plan and proforma, which costs a little over \$63,000.

We are so grateful and honored that Straban Township has sent us a check for \$26,050 from their ARPA funds, to be used towards the fiber broadband business plan/proforma. As mentioned in our January letter, Abbottstown Borough has budgeted \$25,000 of their ARPA funds for the project, to be released in June of this year. Our gratitude is extended to Abbottstown Borough as well.

This brings the total dollars available for the business plan at \$51,050, leaving us a little over \$12,000 shy of the \$63,000+ needed to have AeCom complete the plan.

The business plan/proforma is a key component in our plan to apply for Federal grants to fund the fiber broadband construction project. The funds from the infrastructure bill signed last December are potentially slated to be available by the 4th quarter of 2022 or in 2023, which means time is of the essence to have all the data we need to show that we have a viable plan to build and successfully operate a high speed fiber broadband internet network in Adams County.

We will be setting up a separate entity for the fiber broadband network organization, which will be a subsidiary of Community Media. We have on standby a telecommunications law firm from Pittsburgh, Cohen Law Group, that will set up the organization according to telecommunications law. This will cost us between \$3000 - \$4,000 dollars.

The total amount we need to give the go ahead to AeCom and the Cohen Law Group is \$16,000. We are humbly asking that if any township or borough has unused ARPA funds to consider helping us in our next step in building a high speed fiber broadband internet network.

Finally, we are drafting the organizational structure and values of the new entity, and also working on identifying leaders in Adams County who would be willing to serve on the board of the new organization.

PA SMALL WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrades Project

Awarded: \$425,000

GMS has submitted the second reimbursement request (\$189,805) in April 2022. This request maximized the \$425,000 grant award. However, invoices and proofs of payment must be submitted through the completion of the project.

Next Steps: The Authority should provide additional Applications for Payment and cancelled checks to GMS when available.

ADAMS COUNTY PARKS, RECREATION, AND GREEN SPACE GRANT PROGRAM

Carroll Valley Path System - Phase I

Awarded: \$25,000

The County approved the extension request, the initial extension request ran to June 30, 2022 and the subsequent extension extends the grant to December 31, 2022. GMS will connect with the County on the approval of the re-scope request.

Next Steps: If the County approves the re-scope request, and once work commences, the Borough should forward project invoices and cancelled check payments to GMS for reimbursement submissions.

H2O PA – WATER SUPPLY, SANITARY SEWER, AND STORM WATER PROJECTS (H2O)

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Awarded: \$700,000

The H2O grant expires on June 30, 2023. The Borough met with PENNVEST on August 3, 2022 to discuss additional funding sources. This Project should not be bid until PENNVEST funding award is received.

Next Steps: The Borough should continue to forward all engineering invoices and evidence of payments to GMS. The Project should not be bid until PENNVEST funding is finalized.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Potential Request: \$4.2 million

On August 3, 2022 the Borough, Borough Solicitor, Engineer, and GMS met with PENNVEST and Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to discuss the Project and potential funding opportunities. During the meeting it was discussed that the Project would only be eligible for loan funding. At this time, the goal is to submit the PENNVEST application in November and awards are expected to be announced in February 2023.

Carroll Valley Borough Trail

Grant Request: \$200,000

GMS submitted the Greenways, Trails and Recreation Program (GTRP) grant application on May 31, 2022. It is anticipated that awards will be announced in fall 2022.

Next steps: GMS to monitor application status. GMS to facilitate meeting with and follow-up contact with Representative Moul and Senator Mastriano.

BROADBAND INITIATIVE

Estimated project cost: \$171,503

Next Steps: GMS continues to review potential funding sources that may cover this initiative.

ELECTRONIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS INITIATIVE

There is not an estimated project cost at this time. GMS emailed an overview of a few potential electronic vehicle/alternative fuel vehicle grant programs for further discussion.

Next Steps: Borough to review funding sources provided.

GMS is drafting a notice of funding availability (NOFA) for the Police Officer Hero Pay grant opportunity.

I am concerned about Lot RC 0018, 82 Toms Creek Trail currently owned by Carroll Valley. It is my understanding that Carroll Valley is considering trading this lot to a Liberty Township resident in exchange for another Carroll Valley lot. It is also my understanding that this lot would then be made into a road to create another access point to the Liberty Township property.

I can personally see for myself that many trees on the Liberty Township property are marked to be cut down. My concern is that once the Carroll Valley lot is traded and transformed into a road, the logging trucks would damage the road I live on, Toms Creek Trail, as it is a tar and chip road.

It is also my concern/understanding that once the trade is complete, the Liberty Township resident will use the lot as a logging road to clearcut their land in Liberty Township and then use the lot as an access road to build multiple houses.

As stated, Toms Creek Trail is a tar and chip road and, in my opinion, would be damaged from the logging trucks and other large construction vehicles. Additionally, I am concerned about damage to the bridge on Ranch Trail that would occur. The damage to both Toms Creek Trail and the bridge on Ranch Trail would create added expenses for Carroll Valley residents to repair them. This lot would then be the main access for multiple houses in Liberty Township.

Trading this lot or allowing it to be another access point to Liberty Township would not be in the best interest of Carroll Valley residents and instead would create damage and expenses that can and should be avoided.

Dear Mr. Hazlett:

Thank you once again for your time in this matter of a proposed lot swap for 82 Toms Creek Road. I know your time and attention are valuable and you have given a lot to this issue.

I trust you recall our previous conversations in the past 5 months or so. I would like to be on record that I opposed this lot swap. I will get into the reasons a bit later.

Some background: I own RD 95 (8 Oak Ridge Trail) and have for years. My family members own other lots. My father and uncles own about 85 acres, a parcel adjoining 82 Toms Creek. They inherited the land from my grandparents. We have cared for the forest and stream for decades. In addition, my parents live on Friends Creek Road, down the hill and across the creek from 82 Toms Creek, they have been full time residents there for 30 years.

My parents and my uncles are all in their 80s, battling various health conditions. My brother and I have been assisting my family to understand what is happening with our new neighbor, Mike Capone, and possible impacts on their home and quality of life, a life they've worked a lifetime to create.

When you and I talked previously, you acknowledged that you had stopped a request by my family years ago to obtain 82 Toms Creek. You said you did this because you don't think it is in Carroll Valley's best interest to allow a larger parcel in Liberty Township to gain access to Carroll Valley road ways, which could open the door to development and other activities and costs such as road maintenance, etc would be shouldered by Carroll Valley taxpayers. You also asked me to trust you to make a fair recommendation in the best interests of all involved, prioritizing Carroll Valley residents rightly so, regarding a similar proposal by our neighbor, Mike Capone, who owns a large parcel in Liberty Township and is now requesting 82 Toms Creek, just as my family did previously.

I don't know what you plan to recommend at this point regarding the proposed lot swap but I feel compelled to make my case since I can't be there in person at Tuesday's meeting.

First, I have several procedural questions:

- 1. What is the lot trade process from here regarding the proposal submitted by Mr. Capone to be heard at Tuesday's meeting? Will the swap be denied or granted Tuesday or will the Council take time to review material and allow more community input?
- 2. Is the lot trade proposal, including appraisals with details, supporting documents, and the firm's name, available to the community at this point?
- 3. If more than one person requests a lot swap, will there be an auction? You indicated an auction was under consideration and stated that it is the Council's goal that all lots eventually become privately owned. So I'm wondering why a swap is being considered instead of the auction or are both still possible?
- 4. I also was told by a Carroll Valley resident that you were considering offering 82 for sale to adjacent landowners who are Carroll Valley residents. Is that still an option?
- 5. If the only reason Mr. Capone seeks 82 Toms Creek is to use it in case of emergency (seems unlikely they would build a road and not use it for other activities), couldn't the council vote to allow emergency access and retain the as borough property?
- 6. Would other neighbors be allowed to use 82 for emergency access if Mr. Capone is granted the swap?
- 7. Are others able to propose a lot swap at this time for 82 Tom's Creek? That is something I would like to do if the borough decides not to hold onto it.

Second, I have several concerns which I voiced in our phone calls but will detail here:

- 1. Timing: When Mike Capone purchased the property adjoining 82 Toms Creek, it had clearly been designed as a weekend retreat, not a full time residence. The access across the creek was obviously subject to creek rise and fall and according to the previous owner, was discussed as the sale was negotiated. We are concerned about why this request for 82 Tom Creek is being made at this time.
- 2. Uses of 82 Toms Creek: Since Mr. Capone has been here, neighbors have become concerned with some trees removed from others' property without permission, and trees very close to the property line marked for what we are told is a logging venture. This is relevant to 82 Toms Creek in that if the swap is granted it is possible that logging trucks, construction equipment, delivery trucks etc will be using Carroll Valley Roads via a road on lot 82. An increase in such traffic would be hard on roads, especially the bridge, and detrimental to the neighborhood. Once the lot is swapped, the neighborhood becomes vulnerable to such possibilities. In addition, logging in that area compromises the hillsides and creek, which harms the whole area and many people other than Mr. Capone. Further, increased traffic can result in increased trespassing and crime.
- 3. Proximity to our property: 82 Toms Creek borders my family's property along the back of the lot, about half way. We are concerned that if a road is put through 82 it will increase poachers and other trespassers, as well as causing erosion and other damage to our property during construction and after. Note one of our lots was recently illegally logged stopped only when we were alerted by a neighbor.
- 4. Hogan request was not previously allowed: Our family respected your opinion in the past and your rejection of our request to obtain 82 Toms Creek Road. We are surprised that Mr. Capone's request has been moved forward.

Third, if this lot swap is going forward, although many think the lot should remain borough property, I would like the opportunity to propose a swap of my own for 82 Toms Creek, and have attached the form filled out according to our conversation this spring.

I urge you and the council to thoroughly consider all options for 82 Toms Creek. The residents along the Toms Creek Road that I've talked with strongly oppose the lot trade and the possible consequences for their neighborhood and way of life, as do the property owners along Friends Creek Rd. Neighbors on all sides are united in wanting to preserve the area to benefit the whole community. Residents choose to live there for the quiet, the nature, the safety, the peace.

Perhaps Carroll Valley Borough Council could find a way to retain 82 Toms Creek as borough property and use it for the good of all.

Again, thank you for your time and attention and for forwarding my concerns and questions to the Council.

Clairifiers were cleaned and serviced. Chains were tightened in clairifier #1 Clairifiers were inspected. They are in working order but the condition of the moving parts are deterorating. May need to replace some parts with in the next year.

Chlorine contact tanks were cleaned and serviced

360 ft of line was camerad and cleaned on main trail between Crocus and Dandelion. Inspection was do due to a sink hole that was forming by the manhole at the intersection at Dandelion and Main trail. Inspection showed that the sewer line has not been broken or damaged causeing the sink hole. It is in the schedule to have the manhloe chemically grouted and sealed at the beginning of august to insure the this is not the cause of the issue.

The 2 closest laterals were also inspected to make sure they were not damaged causeing the issue and were found to be in good working order.
