Members reviewed the memorandum of June 11, 2021, announcing that Brad Sanders of Carroll Valley has accepted the municipal services supervisor position with a start date of July 6, 2021. The memorandum also shared that Jeremy Whitmore, of Carroll Valley has been hired as a part-time summer laborer through August.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

# **Grant Funding Updates.**

Members reviewed the written report supplied by Marissa Price of GMS Funding Solutions outlining the various grants being managed by her agency. The report was accepted by consensus.

### **Property Maintenance.**

Mr. Mathews shared that he and Mayor Harris met to discuss the proposed property maintenance flow chart for the enforcement process. Following discussion and further explanation of the content: Consensus of Members agreed to schedule a special meeting of Council for Wednesday, July 14 or Thursday, July 15, 2021, and invite Dave Hazlett, Gayle Marthers, Amanda Bell, and Chief Hileman to attend.

# High-Speed Broadband Update.

Mr. Hazlett is working with Liberty Township and GMS Funding Solutions to apply for COVID-19 Stimulus grant money to move this project forward. He will update as information becomes available.

# **3 Willow Trail Update.**

Mr. Hazlett has reached out to Adams County Tax Bureau, and he will continue to maintain contact with Mr. Ryan of Adams County Conservation and monitor the situation. Borough Solicitor, Zachary Rice offered confirmation that the property remains in the Adams County Repository at this time as it has not been approved for sale. This delay will allow the Borough to work with the County agencies to resolve the issues. Updates will be provided as they are available.

# Sign Ordinance Update.

Borough Solicitor, Zachary Rice offered the following comments:

- Regulating the content of signs is often found to be unconstitutional; therefore, all references to political signage is recommended to be removed.
- The addition of language referencing a "personal expression sign" could be added that would be clearly defined and regulated based on the timeframe, placement and manner by which it is displayed and not on the content of the sign.
- There is state and federal case law to help define the parameters of the verbiage on said signs that allows for the prohibition of certain types of speech or content that is not protected under the first amendment. These parameters could be included in the ordinance to help meet constitutionality regulations of the ordinance.

Following much discussion; Members agreed by consensus to direct Mr. Rice to prepare a draft ordinance for review at the July 6, 2021, Joint Planning Commission meeting with Council.

# **NEW BUSINESS**

Mr. Verderaime requested that the new Municipal Services Supervisor be asked to use the same report format developed by Mr. Wise. Borough Staff will make the request.

Dr. Schubring inquired about an incident where he observed a patrol car parked to the back of the Borough Building running for a lengthy time period; estimated at 30 - 45 minutes. He questioned if it was normal practice to have patrol cars idling for long periods of time while parked at the station. Chief Hileman explained that the numerous electronics used in the vehicles require them to be running or plugged in while idle. It is not typical to have an officer on-station for 45 minutes and leave the car running; they would typically plug it in.

# June 2021 Police Report

### Special News / Achievements:

 Two officers completed their recertifications in advanced emergency medical training and renewed their licensure through the PA Department of Health. One officer recertified as an Emergency Medical Technician, the same level as a basic life support ambulance provider, and the other officer as an Emergency Medical Responder, the same level as a quick response EMS unit.



#### **Monthly Activities:**

In May, officers were dispatched to a report of a suicide in progress involving a veteran, reported by the Veteran's Crisis Hotline at the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. After finally tracking the cell phone to a home in Carroll Valley, investigation determined that the call was fake. One adult and one juvenile face charges for creating a false alarm to public safety agencies. The 24-hour Veteran's Crisis Hotline is so important to our veterans, it makes this misuse even more disturbing.



 Storms on June 21<sup>st</sup> resulted in many trees and wires down throughout the borough, keeping multiple officers quite busy checking these calls, arranging removals and contacting utilities for repairs. • 8 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including 1 active domestic, several roadway issues, and a few fireworks calls.

## **Traffic Enforcement:**

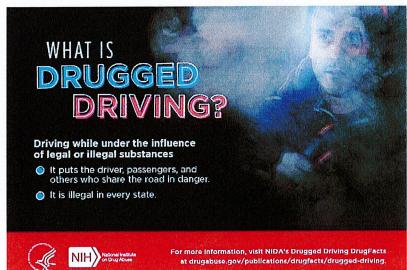
 Officers conducted 45 vehicle stops this month and were called to 1 vehicle crash. Together these resulted in 2 DUI arrests as well as 23 citations, faulty equipment notices, and warnings, 13 of which were for speeding.



#### **Upcoming Events:**

 As part of the National Highway Traffic Safety program, police in August and September will put additional focus on persons driving under the influence of drugs, both legal and illegal.

Police conducting traffic stops nationally say that they're seeing more and



more drivers under the influence of drugs. The data bears it out: the number of drivers killed in crashes in the US who tested positive for marijuana doubled from 2007 to 2015.

# **Finance Committee Report**

Meeting Date: July 7, 2021

The Finance Committee met July 7<sup>th</sup> at 7:20 pm. The following was accomplished during the meeting:

- Review of the 2021 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Budget Execution was reviewed. Twenty-six-line items were questioned and answered to the satisfaction of the committee members.
- With regard to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, under 2021 Budget Revenue it was noted that the Borough received the 2021 installment of \$206,303.02. This amount is one half of the total to be allocated to the Borough. The second allocation will be received in the 2022 fiscal year.
- A brief update on the research being performed on the Group Medical Benefit Plan for our employees was given. Committee was told that a formal report with staff recommendation will be provided during the October budget discussions.
- Review of the 2022 Budget Timeline was briefly discussed.

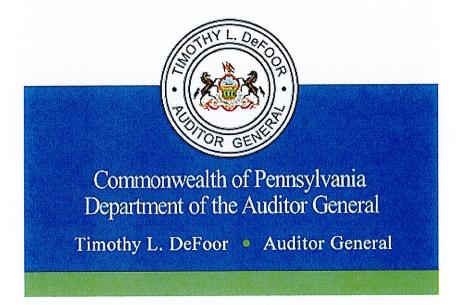

#### Independent Auditor's Report

We examined the accompanying Form MS-965 With Adjustments for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the Borough of Carroll Valley, Adams County, for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. The municipality's management is responsible for presenting the Form MS-965 in accordance with the criteria described in the Background section of this report and the Department of Transportation's *Publication 9*. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the Form MS-965 With Adjustments based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the examination to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Form MS-965 is presented in accordance with the criteria described above, in all material respects. An examination involves performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Form MS-965. The nature, timing and extent of the procedures selected depend on our judgement, including an assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Form MS-965, whether due to fraud or error. We believe that the evidence we obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

We are mandated by Section 403 of *The Fiscal Code*, 72 P.S. § 403, to audit each municipality's Liquid Fuels Tax Fund to ensure that funds received are expended in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States include attestation engagements as a separate type of audit. An attestation engagement performed pursuant to *Government Auditing Standards* involves additional standards that exceed the standards provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Accordingly, this attestation engagement complies with both *Government Auditing Standards* and Section 403 of *The Fiscal Code*.

In our opinion, the Form MS-965 With Adjustments presents, in all material respects, the information required by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the Borough of Carroll Valley, Adams County, for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, in accordance with the criteria described in the Background section of this report and the Department of Transportation's *Publication 9*.

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we are required to report all deficiencies that are considered to be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control; fraud and noncompliance with provisions of laws or regulations that have a material effect on the Form MS-965; and any other instances that warrant the attention of those charged with governance; noncompliance with provisions of contracts or grant agreements, and abuse that has a material effect on the Form MS-965. We are also required to obtain and report the views of responsible officials concerning the findings, conclusions, and recommendations, as well as any planned corrective actions. We performed our examination to express an opinion on whether the Form MS-965 is presented in accordance with the criteria described above and not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on internal control over reporting on the Form MS-965 or on compliance and other matters; accordingly, we express no such opinions.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Form MS-965 will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Form MS-965 will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over reporting on the Form MS-965 was for the limited purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the Form MS-965 is presented in accordance with the criteria described above and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Form MS-965 is free from material misstatement, we performed tests of the Borough of Carroll Valley, Adams County's compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of amounts on the Form MS-965. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our engagement, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### Background

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law, Act 655 of 1956, as amended, (72 P.S. § 2615.5 et sec.), provides municipalities other than counties (townships, boroughs, cities, towns, home rule, and optional plan governments) with an annual allocation of liquid fuels taxes from the state's Motor License Fund to be used for the maintenance and repair of streets, roads, and bridges for which the municipality is responsible. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based: (1) 50 percent on the municipality's proportion of local road mileage to the total local road mileage in the state, and (2) 50 percent on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population in the state.

*The Vehicle Code*, Title 75 P.S. § 9511, provides municipalities with annual maintenance payments to be received from the Motor License Fund for functionally local highways that were transferred to a municipality from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Each municipality must deposit the allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds and annual maintenance payments that it receives into a special fund called either the Municipal Liquid Fuels Tax Fund or State Fund. A municipality may not deposit any other monies into this fund except when the municipality does not have enough money in the special fund to meet the payments called for by its current annual budget for road and bridge purposes. In such a case, the municipality may borrow money or transfer money from its General Fund to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The Department of Transportation has been given the regulatory authority for the administration of these funds. Department of Transportation's *Publication 9* includes the policies and procedures for the administration of Act 655, as amended, and the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money. However, if there is a difference between *Publication 9* and any legislation, the legislation shall govern.

To qualify for the annual allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds, *Publication 9* indicates that each municipality shall:

- 1. Submit annual reports (MS-965, Actual Use Report, MS-965P, Project and Miscellaneous Receipts, and MS-965S, Record of Checks).
- 2. Make deposits and payments or expenditures in compliance with Act 655 of 1956, as amended. Failure to do so may result in not receiving allocations from PennDOT until all discrepancies are resolved. *Publication 9*, Section 2.6, includes information about investing Liquid Fuels Tax monies, using loan or bond proceeds, and types of receipts into the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

#### Background (Continued)

- 3. Submit the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Report of Elected and Appointed Officials by January 31<sup>st</sup> and the Survey of Financial Condition By March 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 4. Ensure resolution of all Contractor Responsibility Program (CRP) holds and blocks imposed by the Department of Revenue and the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 5. Ensure resolution of all reimbursements required as a result of audits performed by the Department of the Auditor General or monitoring reviews performed by the Department of Transportation's Financial Consultants.

#### Criteria

The criteria for the Form MS-965 With Adjustment are described below.

Section 1 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments provides a summary of Liquid Fuels Tax Fund expenditures by category. Categories requiring explanation include:

• Major equipment purchases are purchases of road machinery and road equipment with varying yearly costs in excess of the amounts indicated below:

• Agility projects are exchanges of services with the Department of Transportation.

#### Background (Continued)

Section 2 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments provides information on the fund balance. Categories requiring explanation include:

- The state allocation is available from the Department of Transportation in March of each year. The amount the municipality receives is based half on its population and half on its road mileage.
- Municipalities that transferred roads from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the municipality through the Highway Transfer Program receive annual turnback allocations in March of each year from the Department of Transportation. Turnback allocations are based on the mileage of the roads transferred.
- Expenditures include the total transferred from Section 1.

Section 3 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments determines if the municipality expended Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money in excess of the permissible amount for equipment and the balance that the municipality may carry forward for the purchase of equipment to the subsequent year.

Department of Transportation *Publication 9* requires that the amount expended for equipment purchases in a given year not exceed the sum of the equipment balance carried forward from the previous year and 20 percent of the current year's Liquid Fuels Tax Fund allocation and, if applicable, 20 percent of the turnback allocation plus other Department of Transportation approved adjustments.

If the municipality spent in excess of the amount listed on Line 4, the excess must be reimbursed to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The equipment balance to be carried forward for the subsequent year is the lesser of the amount on Line 6 or the ending fund balance on Line 6 of Section 2, but not less than zero.

#### Background (Continued)

#### Basis of Presentation

The financial activities of the municipality are accounted for in separate funds. The Liquid Fuels Tax Fund is used to account for state aid revenues from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation used primarily for building and improving local roads and bridges. The Form MS-965 has been prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation as a result of the Fuels Tax Act 655, dated 1956 and as amended, which does not constitute a complete presentation of the entity's assets, liabilities, expenses, and fund balance. Accordingly, the presentation of Form MS-965 With Adjustments is restricted to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund, which represents a segment of the entity.

#### Basis Of Accounting

The accompanying Form MS-965 With Adjustments is prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Under this method, revenues are recognized when received and expenditures are recorded when paid.

#### General Fixed Assets

General fixed assets are recognized as expenditures at the time of purchase. No depreciation has been provided on the heavy equipment used to maintain and repair roads and bridges.

Awarded \$425,000

GMS is gathering the necessary documentation to submit the first reimbursement request, including bid tabulation and proposals.

Next Steps: The Authority should provide GMS with the fully executed construction contract with Doli Construction when available and proof of public advertisement of the bid solicitation. Wm. F. Hill (engineering) and Doli Construction invoices and copies of payment should also be provided to GMS. GMS will draft payment requests for partial reimbursement.

#### ADAMS COUNTY PARKS, RECREATION AND GREEN SPACE GRANT PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Path System - Phase I

Awarded \$25,000

GMS has submitted a re-scope request to the County requesting to move the trail from the original proposed alignment to the new location on Borough-owned land. The County has not made a decision as of the date of this memo.

Next Steps: GMS will follow-up with the County regarding the re-scope request. If the re-scope is approved, the Borough should coordinate with FSA and continue to forward project invoices and cancelled check payments to GMS for reimbursement submissions.

#### H2O PA – WATER SUPPLY, SANITARY SEWER AND STORM WATER PROJECTS (H2O)

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Awarded: \$700,000

H2O PA funds will be used for the second phase of the WWTP project, which the Authority plans to prioritize after Phase I has started. The H2O grant expires on June 30, 2023. *The Authority should begin the design process for the Project.*

#### **BUTTERFLY GARDEN / CHARNITA WISHING WELL**

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful – Healing the Planet Grant Program

Request: \$15,000

A grant application to the Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful – Healing the Planet Grant Program was submitted on June 30, 2021. The total project cost is estimated at \$20,900, including a grant request of \$15,000 and pledged Borough matching funds in the amount of \$5,900. The grant application scope of work includes the following: (1) demolition and removal of the current concrete walking paths; (2) construction of walking bridge; (3) removal of existing benches and installation of two new sitting benches; (4) necessary site restoration and new landscaping to include new plantings; and (5) implementation of an erosion and sediment control plan.

Next Steps: Awards are anticipated to be announced in July/August 2021.
