MAYOR'S REPORT



October 2020 Police Report

Special News / Achievements:

• After an officer was called to check on an elderly resident, he found her family couldn't reach her because her phone was out of service. Police administrative assistant Jo Ann Myers found out and made calls to the phone company to get that service restored. She followed up with the elderly resident, who lives alone and has medical issues, until she knew the phone was working again.





- CPL Weikert received his Controlled F.O.R.C.E. instructor certification and Field Training Officer Certification and will be training our officers.
- Halloween activities occurred both at Trunk or Treat in Carroll Valley and in large numbers in Fairfield. Officers were able to enjoy time interacting with children and parents and providing that all important candy.
- October 24th the Department collected 153 pounds of expired or unused prescription medication for safe disposal as part of the US Drug Enforcement Administration's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. This was our 16th Take Back event.



Monthly Activities:

 We were notified of an attempted murder suspect from Hanover in the Carroll Valley area. On October 16, officers became involved in the capture of the suspect and his accomplice. CPL Weikert was on the team that took the original suspect into custody.



- Investigated a reported rape.
- We continue to have a few incidents of damage or theft of political signs.
- We investigated three incidents of target shooting in violation of the Borough Ordinance.
- Two child abuse investigation were opened.

 9 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including two welfare checks, harassment, and three report of suspicious activity.

Traffic Enforcement:

- Officers conducted 42 vehicle stops resulting in 37 citations, faulty equipment notices, and warnings, 18 of which were for maximum speed limits.
- 3 vehicle crashes, including 2 hit and run crashes that were investigated, and the suspect vehicle identified.

Upcoming Events:

The Department is expecting a drug collection box to be delivered soon. This
will allow us to collect unused and expired medications year-round for our
residents.

The following is a list of modification made to the Budget document since the Budget workshop:

- Added 4 new projects to the Capital Reserve Fund, including:
 - New Pavilion in Carroll Commons (\$40,000) as per the discussion with council regarding the Cortner Pavilion Remodel. This project would be added to the 2021 project list, concurrent with the Cortner Pavilion Remodel.
 - <u>Lake Carroll Dam Tree Removal (\$25,000)</u> Added to the project list for 2021, pending council's approval of the project.
 - o Lake Carroll Inlet/Outlet Repairs (\$125,000) Added to the project list for 2022.
 - <u>Lake May Emergency Outlet Valve Replacement (\$75,000)</u> Added to the project list with an undefined year of expenditure. We will need to do this, but still unsure if it will be done in 2021 or 2022.

BUDGET NOTICE

The 2021 proposed budget for the Borough of Carroll Valley has been tentatively adopted with the intent to set the following tax rates: Real Estate - 2.45 mils.; Dedicated Fire/EMS - .25 percent; Earned Income - .50 percent; Realty Transfer - .50 percent; and Admissions – 5.0 percent or as permitted by law. In your packet you have several pieces of information regarding ongoing concerns expressed by Lake Carroll Property Owners.

I have included both the formal report given by our Dam Engineer, Andy Kulik, as well as his email transmitting the report, which included other information. I spoke with Andy on Wednesday regarding the concern of rotting roots if trees were removed as he recommends. He stated that the preference would be to remove the roots and stumps and backfill with suitable dam embankment material. We have gotten a couple quotes to have the trees removed which indicate the cost to be around \$25,000, but that did not include the removal of roots or stumps or placement of fill.

I followed up with Engineer Kulik to get further clarification on the tree removal, requesting he rank 3 options, 1) do nothing 2) cut down trees and 3) cut trees and remove stumps and roots. He stated that option 2 was preferred to option 1, but that option 3 was the ideal solution. At this time I have not explored getting cost estimates for option 3.

Ultimately, the Borough needs to weigh the liability of each of the 3 options and proceed as comfortable.

Our memorandum that verifies the observations made by Toth Brothers Clearing & Dredging Inc. is attached. Based on our site inspection on August 26, 2020, below are additional recommendations. We feel the top 2 recommendations are most important. The remaining ones, they are NOT listed in order of preference or importance.

- Given the height and water storage volume of Lake Carroll, it may be regulated under the act and section 302 of the <u>Flood Plain Management Act (32 P.S. § 679.302)</u>. Presently the dam that impounds the water of Lake Carroll is not regulated by PADEP. Recommend investigating if Lake Carroll Dam meets the above referenced criteria and should be regulated by PADEP.
- Trees observed on dam embankment and within 25-feet of downstream toe and abutment contacts.
 Recommend removing trees, woody vegetation, and tall vegetation from dam embankment and 25 feet beyond downstream toe and abutment contacts that meet natural high ground.
- Concrete at intake is deteriorated and wooden stop logs are leaking. Recommend repairing deteriorated concrete and repairing/replacing wooden stop logs.
- Bare spots noted along the dam crest and upstream slope. Recommend establishing grass cover to prevent further erosion.
- Sparse riprap cover on upstream embankment near north side of dam embankment. Recommend supplementing upstream embankment with riprap where warranted.
- Concrete deterioration along principal spillway weir and spillway channel. Recommend repairing deteriorated concrete.
- Debris in principal spillway channel. Recommend removing debris from spillway channel.

We are submitting this letter to you to provide our evaluation of the observations performed by Toth Brothers Clearing & Dredging Inc. that were provided to Dr. Robert H. Reid, MD in a letter dated July 16, 2019. This letter was provided to the Carroll Valley Borough Council via letter dated August 12, 2020 from Hartman & Yannetti, Attorneys at Law. The letter from Hartman & Yannetti suggests the conditions identified by Toth Brothers Clearing & Dredging are a dam safety concern.

Mr. Andrzej Kulik, PE, MEM, CDT of Gannett Fleming, Inc. (GF) performed a site inspection of Lake Carroll, also known as Lake Charnita, on August 26, 2020. The observations made by Toth Brothers Clearing & Dredging were verified. Our professional assessment of the identified conditions is that they are not hazardous to the safety to the dam embankment that impounds Lake Carroll and its appurtenances (i.e. intake, spillway, and outlet works).

Observations made by Toth Brothers Clearing & Dredging are provided below, accompanied by our response. Photos accompanying each GF response are appended herein.

1. Charnita Lake does not need dredging.

GF Response: Concur. Very little sediment was observed at the outfall. See Photo 1.

2. Re-charge is from steel 10/12-inch diameter pipe behind the existing dam (in channel flash boards). This concrete dam and appurtenant structure are in need of repair soon.

GF Response: This is not a danger to the dam embankment. However, intake structure is deteriorated and in need of repair. See Photo 2.

- 3. Pond inlet area is approximately 10,800 square feet and has approximately 1-1/2 feet of sediment (approximately 600 cubic yards), should be dredged simultaneously with the pond level down 2 feet for inlet repair.
 - GF Response: Sediment was observed in the intake area. Aside from leaves in the intake pipe screen, the intake pipe was not obstructed by sediment. See Photo 3.
- 4. Owner should consider a 90 degree elbow on the inlet pipe to reverse feed, this would help eliminate sediment loads dispersing into pond during storm events.
 - GF Response: The invert of the intake pipe is elevated approximately 2 feet above the stream bottom. Very little sediment was observed at the outfall with current configuration. See also response to first observation. A reverse feed configuration does not appear to be warranted. See Photo 3.
- 5. We did not attempt to operate the gate valve/this is not a regulated dam so it's operation is not a requirement by dam safety.
 - GF Response: Concur. Gate valve was not operated during GF's site inspection. See Photo 4.
- 6. Finally, the outlet structure is need of repair. This repair should be taken seriously as water is following the wing walls around/under and below the existing dam.

GF Response: This is not a danger to the dam structure at this time. We do concur the training walls downstream of the principal spillway need to be repaired. If left unattended, overtime flow around/under the downstream left training wall and spillway channel slabs could lead to dam embankment erosion. See Photos 5 thru 10.



This letter is in response to your letter of October 8, 2020, with the enclosure of Inspection of Lake Carroll by Mr. Andrzej Kulic of Gannett Fleming, Inc. on September 9,2020.

It is duly noted that the Borough of Carroll Valley intends to complete the items identified by Mr. Kulic under his supervision.

The Lake Owners would like to be notified of the schedule for completing the items identified by Mr. Kulic. The repair of the outlet structure with leakage around the spillway should have the highest priority and be completed as soon as possible.

It is understood the need to remove all the trees from the top of the dam down to Tom's Creek. This tree removal is critical to maintain the integrity of the dam. Also, trees should be prevented from growing on the dam in the future.

The notification is appreciated that the Lake will be lowered for the Winter months starting December 1, 2020. This will allow the Lake owners to plan to carry out maintenance on their properties, especially their docks. While the Lake level is low, the Lake should be closed to public boating, say December 1st to March 1st. This is a common practice other nearby lakes do that lower the water levels during the Winter months, such as Lake Meade. A control valve on the Lake intake pipe would be very useful to be turned off while the Lake is at a low level. Also, the valve could be turned off when the Lake is full and Tom's Creek is lower to prevent back flow.

The release of water should be such that it will collect at the intake and flow into Lake May. The amount going into Lake May can then be calculated. This amount along with additional water will be withdrawn by Ski Liberty under a water lease agreement between the Borough and Ski Liberty in which Ski Liberty pays the Borough \$25,000.00 each year. The percentage of water from Lake Carroll should indicate the percentage of the \$25,000.00 that should be set aside for maintenance of Lake Carroll.

The entire Lake sediment was measured and reported in the Toth Summary. Special attention concerned the area of the dry hydrant, which is near the Lake intake. The intake pipe for the dry hydrant was blocked by sediment 1.5 feet high. After the Toth summary, a fire company cleared the intake pipe by reverse blowing.

This intake pipe should be clear at all times so the dry hydrant is available for a fire company to pump water from the Lake to fight fires. Currently the pipe will become blocked again with the amount of sediment covering and surrounding it. There are two ways to maintain the intake pipe clear of sediment. Either a fire company could routinely clear the pipe by reverse blowing or the sediment be removed up to 60 feet from the shoreline as recommended in the Toth summary. Following removal, reoccurring accumulation should not be a problem for at least 10 years.

The Borough has maintained the Lake free of weeds and algae for the past several years by the monthly addition of herbicide chemicals to the Lake during the growing seasons. Previously sterile triploid weed carp were used with excellent results for 15 years. At that time, the carp matured to large size, stopped eating the weeds and began to die off. Consideration should given to again begin using the sterile triploid weed carp. Thirty-six sterile triploid weed carp could be introduced into the Lake for a cost of \$900.00. Not having to use chemicals could save the Borough \$18,000.00 over the next 15 years.
