BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

RESOLUTION #3-2021

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY, ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AUTHORIZING THE EXCHANGE OF A PARCEL OF LAND MEASURING 0.52 ACRE OWNED BY THE BOROUGH OF CARROLL VALLEY AND IDENTIFIED AS TAX PARCEL ID NO. 43047-0100-000 ("LOT R-0041"), FOR A PARCEL OF LAND MEASURING 0.53 ACRE OWNED BY JOHN S. EIKER, JR. AND RACHEL M. EIKER AND IDENTIFIED AS TAX PARCEL ID NO. 43045-0055-000 ("LOT RA-0030"); PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT BY JOHN S. EIKER, JR. AND RACHEL M. EIKER OF ANY COSTS RELATING TO THE EXCHANGE OF LOT R-0041 FOR LOT RA-0030, AND DESIGNATING OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY FOR THE EXCHANGE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1201(4) of the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §1201(4), the Borough of Carroll Valley (the "Borough") may purchase, exchange, acquire by gift, or otherwise hold, lease, let and convey, by sale or lease, real and personal property deemed to be in the best interest of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3301.1(d) of the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. § 3301.1(d), approval of the acquisition, disposition and leasing of real or personal property shall be by adoption of a resolution; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1201.1(d) of the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. §1201.1(d), the Borough Council shall have the authority to exchange real property for real property of equal or greater value, if the property being acquired by the Borough is to be used for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough owns land measuring 0.52 acre, located at 27 Mason Dixon Trail, Fairfield, Pennsylvania, identified as tax parcel ID 43047-0100-000 ("Lot R-0041"); and more fully described in the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference; and being the same real estate that William M. Manko and Anne M. Manko, conveyed to the Borough of Carroll Valley by a deed dated September 17, 2001, and recorded on November 2, 2001, in Deed Book 2451, Page 105, in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds for Adams County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker own land measuring 0.53 acre, located at 18 Blue Spruce Trail, Fairfield, Pennsylvania, identified as tax parcel ID No. 43045-0055-000 ("Lot RA-0030"); and more fully described in the legal description attached hereto as **Exhibit "B"** and incorporated herein by reference; and being the same real estate that Terry Stem conveyed to

John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker by a deed dated August 6, 2020, and recorded on August 11, 2020, in Deed Book 6648, Page 357, in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds for Adams County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Lot R-0041 has an assessed value of Eleven Thousand, Three Hundred Twenty-Eight Dollars (\$11,328.00); and

WHEREAS, John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker's Lot RA-0030 has an assessed value of Seventy-Three Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollars (\$73,440.00); and

WHEREAS, John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker agree to pay all costs associated with the exchange of Lot RA-0030 for Lot R-0041; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to use Lot RA-0030 for municipal recreational purposes; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of this lot exchange, John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker shall complete the necessary steps for a subdivision/recombination plan to combine 27 Mason Dixon Trail, Fairfield, Pennsylvania, identified as tax parcel ID 43047-0100-000 ("Lot R-0041") with 29 Mason Dixon Trail, Fairfield, Pennsylvania, identified as tax parcel ID 43047-099-000 ("Lot R-0042"), into a single lot; and

WHEREAS, this resolution was advertised in accordance with Section 1201.1(d)(3) of the Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S.A. § 1201.1(d)(3); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council deems it in the best interest of its citizens and the general public to exchange Lot R-0041 for Lot RA-0030; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the Borough of Carroll Valley as follows:

- 1. The recitals referenced above are incorporated herein by reference hereto.
- 2. The Council of the Borough of Carroll Valley authorizes the exchange of Lot R-0041 for Lot RA-0030 subject to the Borough Manager and Borough Solicitor being satisfied that any conditions associated with the exchange have been satisfied by John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker, including the requirement that John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker remit all costs associated with the exchange.
- 3. Council of the Borough of Carroll Valley authorizes the President or Vice President of Council and other proper Borough officers and officials to execute any and all documents and agreements between the Borough and John S. Eiker, Jr. and Rachel M. Eiker and to authorize the Borough Secretary to attest to any and all necessary documents to facilitate and assist in the exchange of Lot R-0041 for Lot RA-0030.
- 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

- 5. The provisions of this Resolution shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionally, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.
- 6. All other Resolutions or parts of Resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.


Special News / Achievements:

• In response to a question last month, peer support is available to all first responders. We have decentralized resources in Adams County. Our county crisis intervention team (CIT) members offer support to other departments internally as well as externally. Carroll Valley Police intends to have all officers CIT trained as training becomes available. In addition, we have access to the Cumberland County peer support team. This team can prove a large, more organized response to provide peer support to all responders involved in critical incidents.



Monthly Activities:

• A DUI arrest in May was indicative of the ongoing opioid addiction issue that we are seeing locally, and the country is experiencing nationally. The defendant's DUI resulted in his 5th pending DUI case, all involving opioids. It is continuing to be a problem that crosses all socioeconomic groups.



9 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including 2 active domestics and 3 thefts.

Traffic Enforcement:

 Officers conducted 45 vehicle stops this month and were called to 2 vehicle crashes. These together resulted in 1 DUI arrest as well as 42 citations, faulty equipment notices, and warnings, 23 of which were for speeding.

 will be giving extra focus to
 intoxicated operators during the July
 4th holiday.
- Did you know that even a small amount of alcohol can impair you? For example, a blood alcohol concentration of .02 can effect someone's ability to perform two tasks at one time and that affects your ability to drive safely. Over the holiday weekend, NHTSA and law



enforcement remind drivers to Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over and motorcyclists to Ride Sober or Get Pulled Over. The goal of these campaigns is to make sure people aren't drunk behind the wheel or on a motorcycle.

Drunk driving isn't the only risky behavior causing crashes on our roads; drug-impaired driving is an issue too. Whether the drug is obtained legally or illegally, drug-impaired driving is dangerous and illegal in all states. That's why over the Fourth of July holiday, NHTSA is again launching the "If You Feel Different, You Drive Different" campaign. Driving while drug-impaired puts you, your passengers, pedestrians, and other drivers in danger.

PA SMALL WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility Upgrades Project

Awarded \$425,000

GMS is gathering necessary documentation to submit the first reimbursement request, including bid tabulation and proposals.

Next Steps: The Authority should provide GMS with the fully executed construction contract with Doli Construction when available and proof of public advertisement of the bid solicitation. Wm. F. Hill (engineering) and Doli Construction invoices and copies of payment should also be provided to GMS. GMS will draft payment requests for partial reimbursement.

ADAMS COUNTY PARKS, RECREATION AND GREEN SPACE GRANT PROGRAM UPDATE

Carroll Valley Path System - Phase I

Awarded \$25,000

GMS to coordinate with the Adams County Office of Planning & Development on a potential re-scope request to move the trail from the original proposed alignment to the new location on Borough-owned land.

Next Steps: If the re-scope is approved, the Borough should coordinate with FSA and continue to forward project invoices and cancelled check payments to GMS for reimbursement submissions.

H2O PA – WATER SUPPLY, SANITARY SEWER AND STORM WATER PROJECTS (H2O)

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Awarded: \$700,000

The H2O PA funds will be used for the second phase of the WWTP project, which the Authority plans to focus on after Phase I has started. The H2O grant expires on June 30, 2023. *The Authority should begin the design process for the Project.*

Next Steps: The Borough should forward all engineer invoices and evidence of payments to GMS. Once the Project is designed, the Authority should move forward with the bidding process. The Authority should provide GMS all draft bid documents for compliance review prior to public advertisement and solicitation of bids.

BUTTERFLY GARDEN

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful - Healing the Planet Grant Program

The Borough has expressed interest in completing the Butterfly Garden project. The Healing the Planet grant program is identified as a potential funding source. A preliminary project cost estimate was provided to GMS and totals \$20,900. The program is available for grant requests in the amount of \$2,500, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$15,000, or \$25,000. GMS is recommending a grant application for \$15,000 with the Borough providing match of \$5,900 – increasing the competitiveness of the application. The grant has a deadline of June 30, 2021.

Next Steps: GMS will continue drafting the grant application and coordinating with the Borough for grant submission. Awards are anticipated to be announced in July/August 2021.

COVID-19 ARPA LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (LFRF)

Request: \$206,303.02 (first tranche); \$206,303.02 (second tranche)

The Borough has been designated as a non-entitlement unit of local government (NEUs) and must access the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds through the Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Single Application site. Based on the Borough's operating budget, the Borough is entitled to request the max allocation (\$412,606.04) —which will be broken out into the first trance (\$206,303.02) and the second tranche (\$206,303.02). GMS is coordinating with the Borough to reactivate its System for Award Management (SAM) registration. GMS is drafting the application and has provided the necessary forms for signature by Borough officials.

Next steps: The Borough should complete the SAM registration process and sign the necessary forms for the grant application.
