



# April 2021 Police Report

## Special News / Achievements:

- Carroll Valley Police Department, and Liberty Twp PD, in cooperation with the US Drug Enforcement Agency and Collaborating for Youth gave the public its 17th opportunity in 9 years to prevent pill abuse and theft by removing from their homes, potentially dangerous, expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Police collected 222 pounds of medication which was delivered to the DEA for destruction.



- As a reminder, the Carroll Valley Borough Police Department has partnered with the Rite Aid Foundation and KidCents Safe Medication Disposal Program to offer a medication disposal unit at the police station. Items accepted include prescription medications and over-the-counter medications. This collection will not accept illegal drugs or paraphernalia, lotions or liquids, inhalers, aerosol cans, needles, thermometers and hydrogen peroxide. Drop off can be made anytime the office is open. The department does not collect any information from the individual dropping off the medications.

- Pennsylvania's new Move Over Law came into effect April 27<sup>th</sup> and requires drivers approaching an emergency response area who are unable to safely merge into a lane further away from the response area to slow to at least 20 mph less than the posted speed limit. An emergency response area is where an emergency vehicle has its



lights flashing, or where road crews or emergency responders have lighted flares, posted signs, or try to warn travelers.

### Monthly Activities:

- CPL Weikert responded to a drug overdose involving two victims. He administered our Narcan and working with EMS, one patient survived. Drug overdoses continue to be an issue with numbers spiking nationwide during the pandemic.
- 5 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including an alarm and a burglary in progress.



### Traffic Enforcement:

- Officers conducted 61 vehicle stops and were called to 1 vehicle crash which, together, resulted in 3 DUI arrests, 67 citations, faulty equipment notices, and warnings, 33 of which were for speeding.



### Upcoming Events:



•As part of the National Highway Traffic Safety programs, police in May will be giving extra focus to seat belt enforcement. Pennsylvania's seat belt law requires drivers and passengers 18 years and older to wear a seat belt when behind the wheel or in the front passenger seat. If you are a driver 18 or older and police pull you over for another violation, you'll receive a second ticket if you or your front-seat passenger aren't wearing seat belts. If you are a driver or passenger under 18 years of age, you must buckle up anywhere in the vehicle. This is a primary offense for drivers and passengers under 18 years of age and does not require another traffic violation to receive a ticket.
