Special News / Achievements:

- With spring and the warmer weather upon us, the police are again receiving calls regarding speeding and dangerous vehicle operation and officers will be focusing on detecting aggressive driving and taking action. Don't let the beautiful weather go to your head, slow down and enjoy it.

- Unemployment fraud is on the rise. With the amount and duration of unemployment benefits being increased with COVID claims, unemployment insurance claims fraud is becoming more relevant. Criminals are using identifying information from victims to file false unemployment claims. With the strain already felt by the overstretched unemployment office, some of these fraudulent claims are successful. Should you receive a notice that you applied for unemployment that you didn't file, contact that state unemployment office to report it. Most have contact methods on their websites. Do not use the information on the notice just in case the notice itself is fake.



Monthly Activities:

- Police took reports on two individuals that had their identifying information used to file unemployment claims in other states.



- A fight involving 5 juveniles in Carroll Commons was stopped and the juveniles referred to Juvenile Probation.
- 2 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including a suspicious activity and a domestic disturbance.

Traffic Enforcement:

- Officers conducted 38 vehicle stops and were called to 1 vehicle crash resulting in 40 citations, faulty equipment notices, and warnings, 10 of which were for unregistered or expired vehicles.
