NOTE: Based on feedback from the Borough Council Ad Hoc group, it is our pleasure to present this new report format for your consideration. Please note historical data has not been added, pending feedback on the format.

Special News / Achievements:

- During the month, new Patrol Officer Eric Peiffer participated in our field training program in order to test his academy training, acclimate him to the Department and train him in our methods and procedures. Corporal Clifford J. Weikert acted as his field training officer (FTO), observing his performance, teaching, and counselling him on applying academy training to real world situations.
- Additionally, they spent time each day reviewing various procedures specific to Adams County and Carroll Valley. Progress was tracked with daily FTO Observation Reports and reviewed with the officer. Additionally, he attended specific classes in speed timing devices and the administration of Naloxone, the lifesaving opioid reversal drug.



Monthly Activities:

- There is a clear spike continuing in September in theft and damage to election signs. One subject was charged with theft and displaying fake registration plates in September for an August theft where the suspect was caught as he attempted to flee the scene.
- We recovered wooden carvings stolen from the Jason Stoner at Zora valued in excess of \$800. The investigation remains open.
- We investigated and cleared as unfounded (investigation determined that it was not a crime) a reported burglary to a residence.
- A repeated harassment of a resident was resolved by the identification of the juveniles involved and handled informally with the parents.






- 11 calls occurred outside coverage hours, including a DUI Crash, domestic disturbance, two reports of shots fired and a report of suspicious activity.

Traffic Enforcement:

- Officers conducted 27 vehicle stops resulting in 35 citations, faulty equipment notices and warnings, 18 of which were for maximum speed limits.
- Four vehicle crashes were investigated including when officers captured an intoxicated operator who crashed in a resident's yard and was trying to flee with a BAC of .0207, more than 2 and ½ times the legal limit.
- One additional DUI arrest was made.

Upcoming Events:

- October 24th from 10 AM to 2 PM, Police will conduct a drive through drug take back in front of the Borough office as part of the US Drug Enforcement Administration's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. All drugs collected will be delivered to US DEA for destruction. 
- In October, CPL Weikert will attend a Field Training Officer Certification Program from Penn State's Justice and Safety Institute.  
- Additionally, he will attend a Controlled F.O.R.C.E. instructor certification class with the goal of developing training curriculums and standardizations in low-liability methods of subject control.
